Parents-

We are aware that some children may have received phones or iPads/tablets for Christmas this year. As always, our number one priority is keeping our students as safe as possible when using social media or text messaging. I cannot tell you how detrimental negative social media is to a young child's mind. Studies have shown that there is a direct correlation between anxiety disorders and social media.

In an effort to continue to support our parents, I am including several websites and apps that can help you monitor the activity that is happening on your child's device. I cannot say this enough.... USE IT!!! Putting a phone in the hands of a child that has no protection on it is really setting your child up for dangerous situations including viewing pornography, listenting to demoralizing lyrics and receiving inappropriate sexual content from others. I know many parents "check" phones but I feel it is important to go beyond that and install monitoring apps that mandate your permissions to download or install apps and allow you to view every message sent or received. Just because a message isn't there doesn't mean it wasn't sent. Users can delete or hide inappropriate messages through a variety of techniques. Most of the apps below send you alerts when inappropriate "key words" are searched or used. Often we think device monitoring is a full time job but that cannot be an excuse anymore because products have been created that take all the hard work out of it for you. You don't need to be tech-savy to use these monitoring tools and we are always here for support and advice- simply email Ms. Wilkison for any questions or concerns at kwilkison@cajetan.org

One app that I would like for your to talk to your children about, that is very popular right now, is TikTok. This app can be used for innocent fun or just the opposite. I want you to understand that many of the songs that children dance to on TikTok have degrading and demoralizing lyrics and I think it is valuable to educate your children on the risk of connecting themselves and their image to such content. Our children are becoming desensitized by the messages and content within song lyrics and that is a very tough mindset to reverse later in life.

TikTok is an app that gives users the opportunity to create and share short-form videos with friends, family, and the entire world. The app is especially popular with young people, who enjoy using its tools to combine video, music, and graphics into funny sketches and creative shorts. TikTok is available in over 150 countries and in 75 languages. TikTok runs on both Apple and Android phones and tablets and has selected a 12+ rating on the Apple App Store and Google Play so that parents can use the device-level parental controls provided by Apple and Android. TAX CREDIT APPLICATION TIME!!!

The "Invest in Kids Act," which was passed by the State of Illinois in August 2017, provides strong incentives for donors to support scholarships for Illinois students from low-income families so that the students can attend a non-public school of their choice, including the more than 200 Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic schools in Cook and Lake Counties. Through this program, students have access to scholarships that could cover up to 100 percent of tuition and eligible fees, and donors have control of where their tax dollars are being spent. This year we anticipate over 13,000 new and current Catholic school students will apply for a tax credit scholarship, which is why we need your help. Individuals and corporations that contribute to the Illinois tax credit scholarship program through a Scholarship Granting Organization will receive a tax credit (as opposed to a deduction) on their Illinois state income taxes.

INTERESTED IN BEING A DONOR?

We will again have the 2-for-1 matching program for the next school year (2020/21 school year). This will apply to the 160 Catholic schools operated by the Archdiocese of Chicago when donations are made through Empower Illinois between Dec. 1, 2019, and Feb. 29, 2020.

Donors should designate a specific Catholic school in Region 1 or Region 2 or the Archdiocese of Chicago Catholic Schools. To find the correct region of your school, please refer to this flyer.

Example: A taxpayer donates \$5,000 to an SGO. The taxpayer will be eligible to claim a \$3,750 tax credit when he/she files their previous year's taxes. The donation creates a \$5,000 scholarship for an eligible student at a net cost to the donor of only \$1,250 after the credit.

Total tax credits are capped at \$75 million per year statewide, which equates to \$100 million in donations and scholarships. Taxpayers can roll over their tax credits up to five years.
